The next 1st Degree will be held at the Troy Council on March 12th. There will be a Major Degree held at Highland on March 9th. We always need good Catholic men to help us with the good works our Council does in our parishes and community. Don't expect someone else to ask your friends or relatives to join the K of C, it is your obligation. Our council's membership has declined over 100 members in the last several years.

We will be having the next Communion Breakfast on March 30th after the 8:30 am Mass at Holy Family. This is one of our social events, while showing our support of the parishes. Please come and celebrate Mass with your Council.

If there is a member you believe should be inducted into the Springfield Chapter Hall of Fame, the deadline for you to submit his biography to the Grand Knight is March 31, 2014. We have several worthy members who would be eligible candidates. This is a great way to honor them and thank them for their dedicated service.

One of the K of C sponsored charities is the Newman Campus Ministry Program. This program helps provide a "Home Parish" for our Catholic students away at school. We have several members who donate \$100 annually. If you are able to help with this worthwhile program, there are donation forms on the Council Room bulletin board.

Unfortunately, due to rising costs and lower Bingo player attendance, our Council has been spending more than what we are making. The officers are reviewing this situation and will be making recommendations to the Council to help bring expenditures and income into balance. The first recommendation is to reduce the donations to our parishes by 20%. Please note we are not reducing the monies donated to our parish schools. These are not easy or desired cutbacks but something must be done to ensure a more balanced budget in the future. We also will be charging \$3.00 per person at the next Communion Breakfast. As we go through the year, other cuts will be made unless there is a turnaround in our income. Suggestions are welcomed, but they must come with the desire and ability to help implement them.

Our Council will be sponsoring teams for the 'Bowl for Charity' tournament at Highland on April 5th and 6th. If you are interested, contact the chairman, Ed Gray, by March 21st. This year each participant's cost is \$10 and the Council will pay \$10.
