## Columbus Home Association

Well, spring is officially here and after a very cold and wet winter I'm sure everyone is looking forward to warmer weather. However, some of us here at the Columbus Home Association are hoping that it doesn't get very warm for a couple of months. Reason being, early in the morning on March 4<sup>th</sup>, a couple of criminals decided to get on the KC Hall roof and steal the copper out of our HVAC units. In the process of destroying four HVAC units and puncturing the roof in over 50 places, the thieves managed to do in excess of \$200,000 worth of damage, all for maybe a \$1000 of scrap metal. With the help of Jewett Roofing, McFarland Heating and Air Conditioning and of course Mary Austin, (THANKS MARY) who came in early that Sunday morning, we were able to get things cleaned up by midday and under control so that Bingo would not be canceled. If everything goes well we will have all of the units repaired or replaced and the roof permanently patched by the first week of June.

Believe it or not, there is a little good news here, we have insurance that will probably cover 50% or more of the HVAC Units replacement cost.

On to other subjects, the old hot water boiler system had to be replaced with a new On Demand hot water system at a cost of \$35,000.

Our phone system failed and had to be replaced with a new system at a cost almost \$3000.

Moving on, the Tri-Cities Columbus Home Association elections we're held February 27<sup>th</sup> and all officers and board members we're reelected for another term.

Regarding bingo, it appears that with a few exceptions the new systems are still working very well and our revenue it's up a little.

The week of March 19<sup>th</sup> we got five new video gaming machines in the lounge. We have already gotten positive feedback from some of our players.
