HOW DO WE DO IT? How does the Tri-Cities Council #1098 afford to give the local parishes and schools over \$80,000.00 per year, donate thousands to other charities and community events, sponsor a dinner/dance for Special Olympics participants and their families (over 500 people), \$3000.00 per month rent, scholarships, seminarian support, and pay for a few events for our members? The answer is **BINGOS and Pull-Tabs**. These are our money makers. The yearly dues collected only pay for our per capita assessments from Supreme, State, and Chapter and our office supplies.

We have some of the most dedicated workers around. There are several members who work more than one bingo a month. We also have some wives and other family members who donate their time. A few members work both bingos and pull-tabs.

The main theme of the Knights of Columbus is CHARITY. Our Council lives and promotes this theme.

I just want all of Council #1098 members to understand how we operate. The Council is like all other organizations in that 20% of the members do the work. We want all members to enjoy the benefits of the organization, but we need help. It is very discouraging to have K of C sponsored events that we do not participate in because no one volunteers to be the chairman (i.e. essay contest, soccer kicking contest, etc.). Every year we are short people to work the Tootsie Roll Drive. With 500 members it is hard to believe that we are always asking for help.

Come to a meeting if you have not been for a while. I know people who have been a member for years and have not been to a single meeting since their initiation. If you have opinions on how we can improve, bring your ideas to a meeting.

You can help by just asking members to read the monthly newsletter. How many times have you been asked what is going on in the Council and your answer is 'I don't know' because you have not read the newsletter.

Some people say they need to be asked to help or they didn't know help was needed. You NOW have been asked. You may be surprised that involvement in your Council can bring you enjoyment and great satisfaction. Working one bingo a month would really help ensure our ability to maintain the level of support we now give to our parishes, schools, and community.

Please note that the 4th Degree donates an additional \$80,000.00 per year solely through their Sunday Bingos. Yes, they are short-handed also.

The Blood Drive held on January 21st yielded 23 pints. Thanks to the Blood Drive Chairman Jim DeRuntz with help from Paul Schuler and all those who donated.
